Lazy Susan

You will need:

Shamrock Wooden Lazy Susan Craftsmart Liquid Gloss (2x125ml) Craftsmart Glaze Paste Acrylic Paint or Design Master Spray Paint Paper cut outs Butane Torch











Instructions

- 1. Check the lazy susan is dust free.
- 2. Paint the lazy susan with the colour of your choice 2 coats should be sufficient. Allow to dry.
- 3. Using Craftsmart Glaze Paste adhere your cut outs on to the lazy susan. Allow to dry.
- 4. Using a clean brush, paint a coating of the Craftsmart Glaze Paste over the surface of the lazy susan this will seal the surface and prepare it for the application of Glass Coat.
- 5. Elevate your lazy susan and lay plastic underneath to catch any drips.
- 6. Measure precisely one part resin (red cap) and one part hardener (black cap) in a disposable styrene cup. You do not need to use a measuring vessel, simply compare levels in the transparent bottles for accuracy, allow a few seconds for the contents to settle as the hardener is a little thicker than the resin.
- 7. Blend thoroughly together with a broad flat stirrer for several minutes.
- 8. Flood the surface of the lazy susan immediately, use a brush or spreader to help move the Glass Coat across the surface.
- 9. Bubbles may appear after the pour, we recommend you use a propane torch, sweeping lightly over the surface to remove the bubbles, take care not to scorch the surface.
 - 10. The glossed surface will be torch dry in 24 hours. Allow at least three weeks curing time before putting anything hot on the surface of the lazy susan.
